

PASTOR'S CORNER



THE SEASON OF LENT

As followers of Christ, Presbyterians along with Methodists, Episcopalians, Anglicans, Catholics and others observe the Season of Lent as a time of spiritual preparation for the celebration of Easter. It is a time of fasting, sacrifice, prayer and repentance. During the Lenten season, beginning with Ash Wednesday and lasting 46 days to the Saturday before Easter Sunday, many Christians engage in practices such as these to deepen their connection with God and to reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. The 40 days of Lent (not including Sundays) are symbolic of the 40 days after Jesus' baptism when he was led into the desert by the Holy Spirit to be tempted by Satan.

Fasting during Lent typically involves abstaining from certain foods or luxuries as a form of self-discipline and solidarity with the sufferings of Jesus. Many Christians also use this time for introspection, repentance, and personal growth. The Lenten season serves as a time to renew their faith and draw closer to the core tenets of Christianity.

This time of repentance is not a time of feeling shame but an awareness that sin separates us from God and what Christ endured to save us from sin and death. Repentant sinners seek cleansing from sin, but also freedom from shame. True repentance leads to a 180 degree change of direction and requires true brokenness. Repentance starts with a regretful acknowledgment of sin with a commitment to change.

SUNDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY



Looking ahead, the children will again be processing in with the palms on Palm Sunday, March 24th.


