

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." (Matt 5:4 NIV)

The season of Lent is upon us and many people will be visibly confessing Christianity with crosses of ashes etched on their foreheads, March 5th, Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time to take an inventory of ourselves, consider the ways that we may have denied God's ever good grace offered to us, and meditate on how we may make amends for our short sightedness.

There is a long standing program that calls for self-inventories and corrective measures, the 12-step programs that are so often thought of only in relation to alcohol and drug recovery. I am fully convinced that the church and we Christians can learn much from the 12 step principles.

In the traditional 12 steps, the fourth and fifth steps are the scariest, even though they are the most healing and transformative. Step 4 reads – We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves and Step 5 – We admitted to God, ourselves and someone we trust the exact nature of our wrongs.

This honest reflection is not meant to reduce us to a puddle of shame and regret; it's about examining ourselves, humbling ourselves, and bravely confronting patterns in our lives that do not lead to peace. A searching and fearless moral inventory related to the misuse of power or doctrine might look like admitting ways we have bought into lies of various supremacies, ways we have diminished our own person power out of fear, overpowered others to get what we want, or used power and control to cover up insecurity and self-doubt.

Step 10 reminds us that we do not stop at one inventory. *We continue to take personal inventory, and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.* It reminds me of another beatitude: Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called Children of God. (Matthew 5:8-9). The 12-steps and Jesus words are intertwined for me. Perhaps the most important message for us all is that God sent Jesus to teach us not to bully and coerce people into believing a certain way but to show us how to live a life of love toward all as an example of that which we believe.

Ruth Hazelton from Hamilton has been working very closely with a representative of the Salish-Kootenai tribe to set up various sessions. Topics to be presented include: CSKT Housing Successes and Challenges, Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Crisis, Opioid Crisis and Recovery Possibilities, and the Importance of Tribal Colleges/Education. Helena has selected the book "*Women Talking*" by Miriam Toews for our book study. Carol DayRider has a copy of the book and the study questions if you are interested in reading the book. At last year's retreat, Conrad was assigned the task of table decorations. Plan now to attend this special event, to learn more about our indigenous neighbors, to renew old friendships and make new ones. There have been many improvements to Spruce Lodge, and it will be exciting to see the transformation. A ZOOM planning meeting will be held in April. 


Lenten On-Line Bible Study Galatians

Our On-Line Bible Study returns for the season of Lent. Starting on **Sunday, March 9 at 5.00 pm**, we will explore the epistle of Paul to the Galatians.

"For freedom, Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." -- Galatians 5.1

Overview: Perhaps one of the earliest documents in our New Testament, Galatians has been described as "the Magna-Carta of Christian Liberty." At issue was the critical question, which defined Christianity as a distinct and separate faith rather than one of



of Judaism: In order to belong to the body of Christ, does one have to become a Jew first? Paul answers that question most emphatically: "NO!"

Appropriate to study during the spiritually reflective season of Lent, Galatians bears witness to how quickly and easily people can stray from the

gospel's essential message. The epistle opens not with customarily warm greetings, but a strong rebuke: "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel!"

Galatians also testifies how the power of faith destroys the castes which separate humankind. The broad spectrum of humanity, Paul declares, is brought together in and through Christ Jesus. This unity is defined in the remarkable assertion of Galatians 3.28: "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."
